Science

We will be learning about 'Rocks' and comparing and grouping different types of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties. We will describe in how fossils are formed and recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter. We will also be using our scientific enquiry skills.

Music

We will be learning all about the Ukulele, identify the cords and play a tune.

RE

We will be exploring Sikhism and answering the question "How important is sharing to Sikhs?"

Maths

In maths we will be continuing to develop our calculation strategies. We will also use manipulatives to support our learning of multiplication and division facts as well as using a number of methods both formal and informal jottings. We will also be exploring length and perimeter, with Year 3 measuring in a range of units, comparing as well as calculating lengths and Year 4 calculating the perimeter of rectilinear shapes and polygons.
