#### Agape—Term 2



This term, we will be focusing on our school Christian value of agape. Agape is Ancient Greek and it means self-less love, charity and the love God has for humans. In school it translates into an ethos of care and concern which embraces our school community and beyond. In worship this week we spoke about love, respect, kindness and responsibility for the people around us at school, for family and friends, community groups we belong to outside school, the animals we love, the property we own and need to look after, the town we live in, and the world we must protect. Agape is all encompassing and because it is so all encompassing, it is also the school value that I see every day, in every classroom and when I talk to each and every child here. To me it really defines our wonderful school.

As always, term 2 is a busy term. We have different charity and community events coming up as well as the Christmas celebrations.

Obviously next week starts with school photos and then KS2 are attending the STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics) Fair in town and we will have our Remembrance Day reflection. The following week we will be: thinking about making tree decorations as we are taking part this year in the St James' Christmas Tree Festival; raising money for Children in Need; and watching or walking with our caterpillar through the Trowbridge Lantern Festival parade. Soon after comes Christingle, The Tree Festival display, a travelling pantomime in school and then the nativity, Christmas lunch, wearing Christmas jumpers and a Christmas sock day for a teenage cancer charity. We will be very busy!

In addition, I have attached posters of events at our local church of St John's and at the village hall that are taking place in the run up to Christmas.

Today, we looked back on attendance in Term 1. After an unsettling couple of years, there is a strong focus on attendance from the Government and within Acorn Education Trust. The evidence shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results, opening more doors for children to fulfil their potential. Poor attendance and punctuality, even at the earliest age, can affect achievement later in life so establishing good habits from the start of a child's school life helps children to settle more quickly into their new settings and routines. Regular attendance and good punctuality are important for maximising achievement and gaining the greatest benefit from education. This is why we are celebrating. Certificates were awarded for 100% attendance and stickers for those over 98% but under 100%. It was wonderful to see how many children there were! Let's keep this up in Term 2.

### News from the classes:

Explorers: This week we learnt about thinking skills in assembly, we had to think, puzzle and explore. We are learning about poems and reading them with expression, we watched Michael Rosen perform a funny poem about chocolate cake.

Discoverers: In Discoverers this week we have started our new topics for the term. We are focusing our work in English on a book called A River. We are also learning about rivers and the water cycle in geography; this week we explored where rain goes. We are learning about states of matter in science. In French we are learning how to read, write and say musical instruments in French. In Music we are learning about body and tuned percussion using the theme of rainforests. Alex and Archie

Voyagers: In English, we did a character description from the play Macbeth. In maths, we carried on developing our long division skills in Year 6 and Year 5 worked on factors. We learnt about and labelled a picture of a heart in science and in music we have started a unit called themes and variations. 


